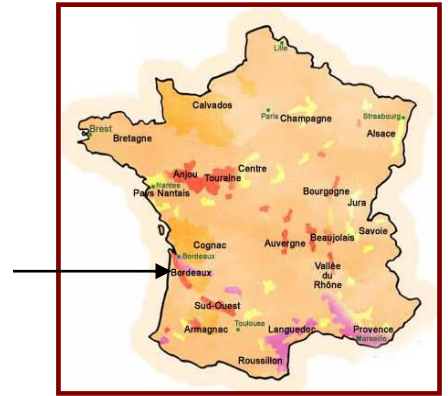
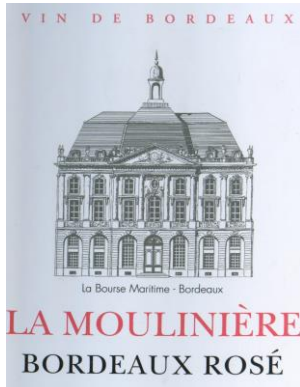


LA MOULINIÈRE

▪ WINE ESTATE

After having left Château Cadillac in 1701, Antoine Laumet, Sieur de la Motte Cadillac, founded the city of Detroit, Michigan and claimed it on behalf of the King Louis XIV. It is his descendants who gave the name of Cadillac to the famous car brand.

Since he took it over in 1991, Jean Jacques Lesgourgues, owner of the prestigious Laubade Armagnac, has completely transformed this estate and, as a patron of the arts, has turned it into a Contemporary art exhibition. The 130 acres property dates back to the 16th century and includes and produces 20,000 cases per year.

▪ SOIL

Light and sandy soils on limestone bedrock.

▪ GRAPE VARIETY

85% Cabernet Franc, 5% Merlot

▪ VINIFICATION

- "*Rosé de saignée*", alcoholic fermentation mastered at 18°C

▪ FOOD PAIRING

For the aperitif, with salads, shrimps, raw fish (salmon), or Italian antipasti including dried cheese.

▪ TASTING NOTES

Bright and slightly pale pink color.

Intense aromas of white flowers followed by small red berries, and completed by a hint of fresh mint.

Dynamic and refreshing palate on the first sip, light bodied rosé with a touch of tannins followed by fresh and fruity flavors.
